SUMMER READING



PAREMATA SCHOOL COMPOST BIN

You might have heard about us - we are the compost group. We are a group of year 5-8 kids who have set up a successfully working compost bin and worm at Paremata School. We are writing this to update you on what we are doing now.

In all of the classes there are now buckets where hopefully everyone is putting their organic food scraps in. Every week the compost group is coming around and collecting all of your waste. This food waste goes into our bigger compost bin and all this waste breaks down. This compost can be used for all sorts of things.

Composting for the whole school is a big job so it would be extremely helpful if you don't bring your food waste from home. Maybe you can compost your own waste!

PAID RESPITE CAREGIVERS POSITIONS

Three of Paremata School's special children are eligible for paid respite care. These are jobs suitable for an older, responsible teenagers or adults. A current, clean driver's license and no convictions is required.

Position 1: A child with autism. You would take the boy on outings or spend time at the boy's home to give parents a break. This may entail playing with the child and joining in games.

Position 2: A child with physical needs. You would take the child swimming, playing ball games at the park and playing modified games. Ideally a young man would be a good companion.

Position 3: A child with autism. You would attend after school care with the child for an hour or so after school probably once a week on Thursday and/or Friday.

These are broad outlines and would be negotiated with parents. They would entail school times and holidays. If you are interested please contact Trish Tennant, SENCO, Tel 233 1339.


CHRISTMAS WISHING TREE - KIDS CLOTHES SWAP EVENT
