Problem: Amur leopards are critically endangered. They are in immediate danger of extinction. They love the cool climate by having thick fur which grows up to 7.5 cm long in winter. For camouflage in the snow their coat is paler than other leopards. Their tongue has tiny rasps or hooks, called denticles, which are used to



scrape the meat off of the bones of their prey. Amur leopards are being hunted because they use their fur for rugs, coats and more. There are only 35 adult
