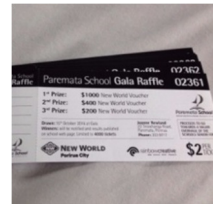

ENVIRONEWS – JAGUARS



Fact: Jaguar numbers are decreasing and they are near threatened.
