Batty about bats NZ native long and short tailed bats

What's cool about these bats is that they are tiny (like mouse-sized, can fit in the palm of your hand) and they can fly a long way. Individual bats can easily travel 50kms in a night, which doesn't take them too long; since they fly at around 60km/h. Habitat is really important to bats. So too is being safe from predators. A DOC ranger visiting a colony in a forest near Ruapehu noticed over a week, an



unknown assailant had repeatedly raided the colony eventually killing 102 of our native and endangered short-tailed bats. They discovered a single cat was the culprit.
