ENVIRONEWS - YIPPEE: SOFT PLASTICS RECYCLING - RUMA KIWI

The Love NZ Soft Plastics Programme is about informing New Zealanders about how to keep plastic bags and packaging out of landfill. Collect all the soft plastics which you use at home, make sure the bags are empty and dry and drop them into the Love NZ Soft Plastics Recycling bins at <u>participating stores</u>

Soft plastic bags are not currently collected for recycling by councils because they can contaminate the recycling process. New Zealanders use over 1.6 billion plastic bags in the home every year. The project takes all soft plastic bags including bread bags, frozen food bags, toilet paper packaging, confectionery and biscuit wrap, chip bags, pasta and rice bags, courier envelopes, shopping bags, - basically anything made of plastic which can be scrunched into a ball.

Customers can bring their used soft plastics <u>back to store</u> and put them in the recycling bin. Bags are collected from store by REDcycle who also run the programme in Australia.
