DOMESTIC DUCK

Domestic Ducks are raised for meat, eggs and down. Many ducks are also kept for show, as pets, or for their ornamental value. Almost all of Domestic Ducks are descended from the mallard. Their scientific name is Anas platyrhynchos

domesticus and their height range is 50 – 76 cm. Their mass is 1.6 – 6.8 kg. There are many breeds of the Domestic Duck including the American Pekin, Indian Runner Duck and many more.
