# TAKAHE'S BEACH LITTER INTELLIGENCE SURVEY



Takahe or Room 14 did a beach clean up with Ben Knight and Jemma Hovelmeier from Sustainable Coastlines on the first Tuesday of this term. We went over the bridge from school and picked up 1,183 pieces of litter from the little beach under the bridge. We were astounded about how this was the most littered site in New Zealand!

Out of the 1,183 pieces of litter, 1,019 pieces were plastic. All of this litter together weighed 45,254 grams. Here is a link to the data we collected: https://litterintelligence.org/data/survey?id=1297

So why did we go and pick up all this litter you might ask? We did it to protect all the creatures in the sea. We have also been learning about the history of Porirua. Our harbour used to be very pristine and clean hundreds of years ago. Unfortunately, it has been becoming more and more polluted because of all the litter that ends up in there. We want our harbour to be clean and healthy again like it used to be! We want to be able to swim, collect kai moana and do lots of other fun activities in and on Te Awarua o Porirua.



We don't want all our sea creatures to die because some of them think that plastic is food. We need to reduce the amount of plastic we use. A good place to start would be our lunch boxes. If we could have less plastic wrappers in our lunch boxes this would really help. It could be as simple as buying a big bag of chippies and reusing ziplock plastic bags or little containers. It works out

cheaper this way too. What other ways can you think of to buy less plastic? My teacher Rachel has just bought a new pair of tennis shoes. They are made out of 90% recycled plastic and they look awesome!

Let's all make an effort to use less plastic and help keep our environment and especially Te Awarua o Porirua (Porirua Harbour) clean and healthy like it used to be before we made it polluted! I think we should do a beach clean up more often!
