

#### Parihaka – by Lila

Parihaka was a settlement in Taranaki, claimed and owned by the chiefs, Te Whiti and Tohu. This settlement that was located under the Maunga of Taranaki was a peaceful paradise. The tribe who lived here wore their signature, snowy white feather which represented peace or passive resistance.

On the 5th November 1881, disaster struck as the Parihaka tribe had been resisting the ways of the government's law. On the same day, 1,600 troops strutted into their village and territory, holding their weapons at the ready. The troops expected to be met with warriors and defence, also with their weapons sheathed in their hands. That thought popped as they walked in cautiously to kids singing, skipping and offering them scrumptious bread. The adults sat frozen on the marae not moving a tense muscle. For some reason the chiefs were arrested and taken to prison ... well they weren't really prisons. They were dark, gloomy caves dug into tall, cold cliffs all the way out along the freezing deep seas of the South Island.

Now we remember that day and how they taught us to be peaceful when we face conflict or problems and never use violence to solve them. New Zealand is a peaceful country and hopefully we all appreciate and learn from the people of Parihaka and their lessons of peace.

#### Parihaka - By Lewis

Parihaka, the Māori village in the shadow of Mt Taranaki. Full of fertile land and great fish stocks. Until 5th of November, 1881 when 1600 troops marched in on Parihaka, ordered to take the land so it could be sold to settlers. Those 1600 troops came armed, expecting the people of Parihaka to fight back. But instead, were welcomed by singing children that were skipping and handing out bread. Why? Because the two chiefs Te Whiti and Tohu ordered passive resistance. Even after the chiefs were arrested and kept in a jail far away without trial for two years. The village was taken, but all the way through they were peaceful, so maybe we can learn something from this peaceful protest.

#### The Story of Parihaka - By Milly

It was November the 5th 1881 and Parihaka was a quiet village that held a Māori tribe. It had two chiefs. But one day the government tried to take the land that they already lived on and they liked it! They could go fishing, grow lots of good crops and climb Mount Taranaki! The chiefs were very good chiefs and they wanted to keep their land but not to fight and not to start a war! So, when the government came with 1600 troops, they were expecting them all to be ready to fight but instead the Māori tribe were all peaceful and doing all their normal things! But people were still arrested. This reminds me of Pōrangi Boy where Niko's grandfather tells him to protect not to fight!

#### Parihaka – By Lily

This Saturday is the anniversary of Parihaka, November 5th 1881. Parihaka was a peaceful Tribe that settled in the shadows of Mount Taranaki. In November 1881, the government sent some troops to go and invade Parihaka. But instead of being greeted with guns, the 2 chiefs Te Whiti and Tohu told their tribes not to be violent. So, the troops were greeted with tamariki singing and skipping across the road offering them bread. The men of Parihaka were sentenced to years in prison without trial.

## The Story of Parihaka – By Ash

On November the 5th 1881, there were Māori tribes living in Parihaka. Parihaka was a village that stood in the shadows of Mount Taranaki. Parihaka had two chiefs. But one day the government tried to take the land from them and sell it! But the people really liked it there! It had great soil to grow crops, places to fish and they could go climb Mount Taranaki! And their chiefs were good ones because they didn't was to attack them, they wanted peace only. When it was November the 5th 1881, 1600 people came loaded with guns ready to attack! But instead, they were greeted with singing children giving them bread. This story reminds me of Pōrangi Boy. It's where Niko's grandfather teaches him how to use a taiaha. He teaches Niko to never to attack but rather to defend.
