



Wellington Water is about to get underway with investigations for a project to upgrade a 4km section of wastewater pipeline in the Paremata area on behalf of Porirua City Council.

The project will increase the capacity and resilience of the local network to cater for residential growth as part of a wider works programme to improve the city's wastewater network. This will also help protect public health that of Te Awarua-o-Porirua Harbour and local waterways.

Investigations for the project start on 27 November 2023 and will take around two months to complete. The work will consist of a series of ground investigations involving drilling bores and test pits along Papakowhai Road, Paremata Crescent and the centre median of SH59 to locate existing services.

While it won't be overly disruptive, traffic management will be in place around the worksites for the safety of crews, pedestrians and road users. This will also result in some short-term loss of parking.

Wellington Water has been working with Paremata School to ensure these works do not disrupt the day-to-day operations of the school or present any health and safety risk.

Where the worksite is in the vicinity of Paremata School, work will be done outside school drop-off/pick-up hours to ensure the safety of children, families and staff as follows:

• 9.30am to 2.30pm

Investigations in the vicinities of Paremata School are planned to start on the week of 4 December for 2 weeks. Activities with a direct impact on the school entrance are planned for the days of 8 and 11 November.

Hours of work have also been planned to ensure minimal disruption to the local community, businesses and road users as follows:

- 9am to 4pm for investigations along Papakowhai Road and Paremata Crescent
- 7am to 6pm for SH59 centre median investigations

# Work starting on Papakōwhai Rd shared path

We're connecting schools, parks and public transport with a new shared path along Papakōwhai Rd to make it easier for people to get around the city.

#### Work starts the week of 20 November 2023 through to winter 2024

All going well, construction is planned to start next week and be completed in winter 2024. Work will be done in sections between Aotea Lagoon and the southern pedestrian railway overbridge, mostly on the eastern side of the road where the existing footpath is being widened. See the map overleaf.

We know Aotea Lagoon is a family favourite and are working hard to minimise disruption.

#### Work will generally take place Monday to Friday between 7am and 6pm.

- · Before 9am and after 3pm work will be confined to the shoulder and shouldn't impact road users.
- · Between 9am and 3pm traffic management like stop/go will impact traffic and roadside parking.

Roadside parking will be reinstated, where possible, after 3pm. Both the north and south lagoon carparks will remain open at all times.

It is possible that detours may be in place during some of the work and that there may be occasional weekend work if needed. Road users can expect delays so should consider using alternative routes where possible. Pedestrian and cycle access will remain open.

#### Features of the work

Work includes a new 3.5m-wide shared path (where possible), raised tables and safer crossing points to reduce speed, better lighting, and the installation of a pump track at Aotea Lagoon.

Parking on Papakōwhai Rd by the southern pedestrian rail overbridge will be moved back approx. 80 metres allowing for road narrowing and widening the shared path.

#### Why are we doing it?

The shared pathway will improve the connection between key locations including Aotea College, Aotea Lagoon, Paremata School and Paremata Railway Station. It will also form part of the Te Araroa Trail and tie in with an upgrade at Whitford Brown Avenue intersection planned for 2024.

#### Funding

This pathway is 100% funded by the Government's Transport Choices Programme, for projects encouraging people to bike, walk, and use public transport. The programme is led by Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency. Under the Government's emissions reduction plan, funding of the Transport Choices package was made available from the Climate Emergency Response Fund (CERF).

### Whitford Brown Ave / Papakōwhai Rd intersection upgrade

An additional upgrade at the Whitford Brown Ave intersection with Papakōwhai Rd is in the design phase, with more work to be done on how to manage underground services during construction.

It is likely to start in the new year and will include signalised pedestrian crossings, traffic signals, an additional left turning lane out of Papaköwhai Rd, better lighting and a new raised pedestrian crossing at the southern entrance to Aotea Lagoon.
