Sweets – Please bring in hokey pokey, chocolate fudge, coconut ice, Russian fudge etc on Friday – *straight to Office* (pre bagged)



On Saturday 21st of October, Zene's family and Georgie and her dad were working at Paremata School in the compost area putting down pavers because the area is always getting mucky.



We had developed a plan in term one and two, to improve the look of the compost area. James [Zene's dad] brought his digger in to get the grass and soil out so we could put the pavers in. We didn't have enough pavers so James, Brianna and Zene went home to get more. They got 30 more pavers. We came back and the sand arrived so we could put down the pavers. We had to put down sand under the pavers to stop the pavers from sinking into the ground.

Then it was time to put down the pavers. The way we did this was by getting a piece of string and placing one paver down so we could line them up. We put down 299 pavers. We used a special tool and cut them to their exact shape so they fitted neatly into the place it goes in.
