Chicken Pox and Vomiting bug

Just to let you know, we have had a number of children throughout the Pohutukawa and Kōwhai team with chicken pox. Early signs are generally fever and spots with a blister on top of each spot. The children are infectious from 5 days before the first spots appears until all the spots are crusted over (usually 5-7 days). We also have some of children with stomach bugs. If your child is under the weather with a vomiting bug please can you keep them at home until 24 hours after the last time they have vomited.

LIBRARY NEWS

Every year towards the end of the year, I do a stocktake of all the library books. This means that I scan all the books the library has and then I get a list of the ones that are missing. This helps keep the information on the library catalogue up to date and lets me know the books that are missing so that I can reorder if I need to, as well as gives me an exact number of books there are.

In order for this to be done, all the library books need to be returned by **Thursday 5th of December** at the latest. After which, I will need to put all the library books in order and check for any books still outstanding.

In week 8 (2nd - 5th December) the library will be open for returns and computer use, but **NO ISSUING** of books.

Week 8/9 (6th - 12th December) the library will be **CLOSED**, including lunchtimes, for stocktake.

Week 9/10 ($12^{th} - 16^{th}$ December) the library will be open for Summer Reading Programme (SRP) issues only.



SUMMER READING PROGRAMME

The school library will again be running the very successful Summer Reading Programme. More information on the <u>'summer reading slide'</u> is below. Children are required to have a signed permission form promising to look after the books and return them by the end of the first week of Term One, 2020. A copy of this is also in the newsletter, or a copy can be collected from the library, their

classroom or downloaded from the library page on the school website.

This means the children get to choose eight books to read over the Summer Holiday.

INFORMATION SHEET





To help stop 'the summer reading slide' and continue to utilise the library books while the school is closed we are running a Summer Reading Programme.

Details:

- Your child/children must not have any outstanding books.
- You may borrow up to eight books.
- You need to have a safe place in your house to keep them. You will be given a bag to help keep them together.
- You (child and parent/caregiver) agree to sign a contract promising to look after the books and return by the end of the first week of Term One, 2020.
- The library will be open:-

Thursday 12th December 8:30am - 9:00am and 2:30pm - 7:45pm (While Christmas carols are on)

Friday 13th December 8:30am - 5:30pm Monday 16th December 8:30am - 5:30pm

enabling you to accompany your child/ren to share in book selection and sign the contract.

Studies show that the effect of the long summer break without reading books and listening to stories can make a significant difference to children's reading achievements. This is known as the Summer Reading Slide.

The summer reading slide is well documented by research - unless students read regularly during the break, they fall behind about three months in reading achievement. The good news is that the latest research shows children who read at least four books over the summer maintain or even increase their skills.

Some facts:

- Kids, who read, succeed the amount of time that students spend reading for fun is the key predictor of students' academic achievement. (Gallik, 1999)
- It takes practice reading, like playing a musical instrument, is not something that is mastered once and for all at a certain age. It is a skill that continues to improve through practice.
- Role models matter students who see adults reading daily or weekly tend to read more and have higher reading scores than those who don't.

Parents / caregivers can help:

- Make the time establish quiet reading time after lunch or in the morning as a part of their daily summer routine.
- Become an expert read up on reading! The following link has wonderful ideas.

- Turn off the TV.
- Reward reading it's okay to use an incentive e.g. sticker chart.
- Cook and read as you prepare a meal together, have your child read the recipe to you.
