

Philippa is an award-winning author of fiction, nonfiction, picture books, plays and poetry, especially for children and young adults, with a strong focus on New Zealand stories and history. Her work has



appeared in the School Journal, publications and been broadcast on radio. Ten of her books have been named as Storylines Notable Books and a number of titles have been shortlisted for the NZ Book Awards for Children and Young Adults, including Enemy at the Gate, Anzac Day: the NZ story, Waitangi Day, The NZ Wars, The Telegram & Amp; This is Where I Stand.

Recently she has teamed up with leading Turkish illustrator Burak Akbay, to tell a tale that crosses the battle lines of Gallipoli, called The Water Bottle Her visit to talk to the whole school on *Tuesday 4th April* is provided free by the New Zealand Book Council with the support of Read NZ programmes.
