## Mike King – By Ysabella Stokes

"Disappointment & self doubt." Those were the words from Mike that described his childhood. Mike was a small boy growing up in Helensville, West Auckland, as a child Mike got easily bullied & often told off, disappointing everyone. He dreamed and longed to be famous because he believed famous people had better lives.

Taking the stage as a comedian for the first time, instantly everyone knew he was going to be a BIG hit! He got everything his heart desired as a child, everyone liked him but deep inside he still felt like the small, alone, sad, bullied boy he was at school.

It was a tough battle because he survived a massive stroke in 2007. But later on in life, Mike decided to change his path and it was when he got called up to speak at a school after 9 students died, it really hit home. "It really showed me how important mental health in our young people are, and how we can stop those little problems becoming bigger problems" Mike quoted. Now Mike works as a mental health advocate also becoming the founder of the key to life trust, I AM HOPE, and his biggest achievement is Gumboot Friday.

Two weeks ago, I interviewed Mike King. He is my role model because of all the mahi he does on mental health, he shows characteristics of kindness, resilience, determination, leadership and many of our 6 C's especially Citizenship, Character and Communication.

### Taika Waititi - My Role Model by Emma Hanlon

My role model is Taika Waititi. He is not afraid to put his ideas out there even if they're unique. This shows that he has a strong identity. He is proud of who he is and he doesn't try to conform or be like all the other film directors.

As Taika grew up his parents got divorced so he lived in two different places Wellington and Waihau bay. His mum was a school Teacher and his dad was an artist.

Taikas parents always encouraged him to be creative.

Taika was good at art so he always thought he would be an artist

But he has a great sense of humor so he became a comedian and then became a producer but he was inspired to make different movies which lead him to becoming a director.

When he first started his job as a director, he made short films like Two Cars One Night and Tama Tu.

Then he started making longer movies like Boy or Hunt for the Wilder People.

His character strengths are creative, courageous and confident and those are strengths I admire. One day I would also love to direct films like Taika Waititi except mine will be my own style and I will strive to be confident and courageous like him.
