MASSEY UNIVERSTIY CHILDREN'S PROGRAMME



This year 17 students took part in the *Massey University Children's University programme*. This was an independent project requiring the students to manage their own time, complete activities of their choice and submit work for marking through a university portal. Activities included every topic you could imagine. The university also collaborated with venues across Wellington such as Te Papa, The Beehive, Pataka and the Police Museum where children enrolled in the programme can go and complete activities in the venues. Activities then accumulated 'Learning hours' for the students and to graduate

a minimum of 30 hours independent learning was required. In June the students were invited to the campus and spent the day moving between faculties checking out what kinds of learning happen and what they might be interested in one day. Paremata school accumulated over 600 hours as a collective. We are so proud! On Monday, 4 November these students were celebrated at the University in the Great Hall and graduated, receiving certificates from the Vice Chancellor of Creative Arts. An absolutely awesome experience for our Tamariki and hugely inspiring in terms of their future endeavours.




CRICKET – PLAYERS WANTED

CAR SEAT CAMPAIGN

A car seat may be one of the most-used pieces of baby gear a parent owns and with each grocery store, day care, or play date trip, they are buckling and unbuckling tamariki numerous times, with the intention of keeping them safe. However, many people aren't aware that child car seats expire between five and ten years from the date of manufacture.



and every time the car accelerates and brakes, the straps strain to fight the forces of physics to keep the seat in place. This can add up to some considerable wear and tear on the car seat's materials. The synthetic fibres in the straps stretch and weaken over time and the plastic in the base and back of the seat can develop micro-cracks that are invisible to the naked eye but can significantly undermine the structural strength of the seat. What this means is that an expired car seat might look totally fine, but if there is a car accident the seat might fail, and a little one might suffer serious injury that could have been prevented.



Expired and damaged car seats, booster seats and baby capsules can be dropped off at Trash Palace for FREE during the month of November where they will be safely disposed of to prevent them being re-used.
