Family Contribution Donation/Technology Donation

As you may be aware, all of our extra school curriculum costs are covered by school donations and we are not able to ask parents to pay for school outings that are part of the curriculum. This means that if you haven't made any contribution this year, other families who have, are covering your child's trip costs, Year 7/8 Technology at Plimmerton School, swimming lessons and aquatic activities.

Moving forward in 2025 we will have to reduce the number of outings the classes go on as the families who contribute cannot keep sustaining the number of families who are not. Regrettably we are currently \$36000 under the threshold if all families paid their school donations. Families are able to get a 33% refund of their school donations using the receipts from school. Using MyIR you upload these receipts into the system. Parents can also pay their donations weekly or fortnightly with an automatic payment or organise a payment programme.

LIBRARY STOCKTAKE AND END OF YEAR DETAILS

ALL the library books need to be returned as soon as possible! One class has already returned all their books - great work Ruma Piwakawaka. When you bring your books back, please either put them in the return bin outside the library or give them to the students who will be coming to classrooms to collect books.



Any outstanding books at the end of the year will have to be paid for and an account will go home

The library is now CLOSED, including lunchtimes, until Tuesday 10th December, so that I can concentrate on doing the stocktake. During the stocktake I scan all the books that the library has in it. This helps to keep the catalogue information up to date, as well keeping an accurate number of books (stock) in the library. I also find out books that are missing and books that are damaged and then what needs to be reordered.



Once I have finished the stocktake the library will open again to run the Summer Reading Programme. The programme helps to stop 'the summer reading slide' and continues to utilise the library books while the school is closed over the long summer break.

What is the Summer Reading Slide?

The long summer break without reading books and listening to stories can make a big difference to children's reading. This is known as the *summer reading*

slide. So you need to read regularly during the break, so that you don't fall behind in your reading. The good news is that children who read at least four books over the summer maintain or even increase their skills.

How do I join the Summer Reading Programme?

- You (child and parent/caregiver) sign a contract to promise to look after the books and return by the end of the first week of Term One 2025.
 Copies of the contract will be available in class, the library, attached to the newsletter or can be downloaded from the library page on the school webpage.
- Your child/children must not have any outstanding books.
- You may borrow up to eight books.
- You need to find a safe place in your house to keep them. You will be given a bag to help keep them together. You will also have a printed list of the books.
- The library will be open extended hours before and after school so you can accompany your child/ren to share in book selection, contracts will be available to sign. Children can also go in class time in arrangement with their teacher (they need a form signed by a parent/caregiver).

poriruacity Keeping of Animals Bylaw Review

Porirua City Council is reviewing its Keeping of Animals Bylaw (2018) to address complaints, simplify enforcement and to prepare for community growth. The goal is to balance the rights of pet owners and the need for their neighbours to enjoy a peaceful living environment.

Key changes:

- Owners are responsible for nuisances, property damage, and wandering animals.
- New bylaw includes cats, requiring desexing, microchipping, and registration within one year of the regulations coming into effect.
 Beehives are restricted in suburban, city and industrial areas, and
- Beehives are restricted in suburban, city and industrial are banned on small properties (less than 500m²).
- Hive owners must provide water and manage bee flight paths.
- Maximum of six chickens allowed per suburban property.
 Stock animals prohibited in city center and suburban areas, with some
- Stock drillings prohibited in city center and suburban areas, w minor regulatory updates.
- Clarifications on stock and poultry definitions introduced.
 Council Officers will have greater power to issue violation notices.
